

1) If elected, will you support the extension of the mosquito program in Kanata North?

I support the mosquito program however I am opposed to the mosquito levy in particular and hyper local taxation in general. If elected I will hold a referendum on the mosquito program, asking residents if they would prefer to continue paying for the program as a special levy or if they would prefer that I push for it to be part of the city's capital budget.

2) What is your solution for the traffic issues on Terry Fox Drive?

I was a leader in pushing for and securing the Terry Fox Drive extension while serving as President of the Briarbrook-Morgan's Grant Community Association. However, Terry Fox Drive now needs to be widened and made 4 lanes, which will be a top priority should I be elected on October 22.

3) Do you support the establishment of a dog park in Kanata North, and if yes, how will you bring it to the community?

Yes. This was part of my platform when I ran in 2014 and I am disappointed that 4 years later nothing has been done. I believe we should put the dog park along the Carp River in Kanata Lakes or somewhere else more viable than the current councillor's unpopular proposal to put it behind Insmill Crescent. I will be consulting residents and commit to getting it done expeditiously.

4) What is your solution to deal with speeding in our residential neighbourhoods?

I support speed control measures without the use of speed bumps or photo radar. I would ensure traffic signals and stop signs are appropriately installed where needed and warranted. As well, I support innovative traffic calming measures, such as planters in the road that force drivers to slow down, speed boards and other technologies that have been successful in other communities. My commitment to securing additional police resourcing for the ward will also help manage speeding in Kanata North.

5) If elected, what steps will you take to deal with the pace of development in our neighbourhoods in Kanata North and in particular the building of developments before services are in place to support the developments?

It's time to get back to Bill Teron's - the father of Kanata - vision of development. That is where nature, connectivity and greenspace were prioritized over cookie cutter houses and deforestation as has been the practice for the last 20 years. I am the only candidate who isn't taking contributions from individuals who do business with the city (i.e. developers, construction companies and big business). I serve the residents of Kanata North, not special interests. It's time for a councillor who stands up to developers and the mayor and the planning department and says "enough is enough — you will not develop if it means disrespecting Bill Teron's vision of a Garden City for Kanata". As

well, developments without plans for expedited infrastructure to support them will not be approved.

6) Do you support Ottawa adopting a ranked ballot by the 2022 election?

Absolutely and unequivocally.

7) Crime is a growing issue in our Kanata North community - how would you increase the police presence to address this issue?

I am the only candidate to be supported by the Ottawa Police Association. I believe we need more policing in our community and will push for a proper allocation of resources to put police service so that they can be a proactive force and deal with incidents of rising crime in our ward.
